Current Title &amp; Duties</p>	<p><b>Edward (Ted) Bruce Cunliffe, Ph.D.</b>  <i>Adjunct Professor-Doctoral Program Psychology</i>  <i>Miami Campus</i></p> <p>As an adjunct faculty member, Dr. Cunliffe teaches and supervises students in the Albizu University forensic track and leads a forensic research group. He also teaches the Personality Assessment II Projective Techniques, Psychopathology, FORE 701 Criminal Law, FORE 702 Juvenile and Family Law, FORE 703 Police and Correctional Psychology, and FORE 704 Forensic Assessment courses. Additionally, he also leads a research group in psychopathy, female offenders, and forensic assessment and a Rorschach Study Group on a weekly basis.</p>

Brief Bio (up to 3 paragraphs)</p>	<p>Dr. Cunliffe is licensed to practice psychology in the State of Florida and over the past 40 years, he has worked with forensic populations in a wide variety of settings including juvenile detention centers, adult prisons, juvenile probation, and community-based outreach programs for at-risk children and pre-adjudication and post-adjudication youth and adults. Specifically, he has served as a Staff Psychologist and Mental Health Director in approximately 20 correctional facilities in Florida and California and has extensive experience providing assessment and treatment services and supervising inpatient and outpatient mental health services in the community, state and county jails and prisons. He has also provided expert witness services to the 11<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, and 16<sup>th</sup> Circuit Courts in and for the Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Monroe counties and the United States Southern District of Florida, and Oregon and the San Luis County Superior Court in juvenile, adult, dependency and probate cases. Dr. Cunliffe's areas of expertise include Competence to Stand Trial, Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity, Dangerousness, Death Penalty, Wrongful Death Litigation, Dependency, Mitigation, False Confession, Life without Parole, and civil litigation. Additionally, he has also consulted with police and Sheriff's departments in Virginia and Florida and has extensive experience providing training and consultation services to administration and correctional staff within the Florida and California departments of correction.</p>

	Dr. Cunliffe has provided workshops and didactic trainings in the areas of psychopathy assessment, traumatized offenders, violence risk, crisis intervention, suicide and criminal behavior at the American Psychological Association and the Society of Personality Assessment, and correctional facilities, juvenile detention centers, forensic psychiatric hospitals and beyond.

Research / Research Interests	Dr. Cunliffe's research interests include the forensic use of the Psychopathy Checklist-Revised, the Rorschach Inkblot Test, the Personality Assessment Inventory, Trauma Symptom Inventory, Second Edition, trauma related disorders in a forensic context, domestic violence, stalking, criminal decision-making, dangerousness and violence risk assessments and criminal recidivism.

Most recently in 2021, he published a book entitled <i>Understanding Female Offenders: Psychopathy, Criminal Behavior, Assessment and Treatment</i> with his colleagues Jason Smith and Carl Gacono.
